

Interpretation

I interpret this to mean that we shall follow the District's Facility Use Operational Procedure 4330 and accommodate community and public use as outlined therein.

Operational Procedure 4330 states that "the district reserves the right to grant or deny use of school facilities at its sole discretion." Further, "the school district reserves the right to deny use of school facilities to any applicant when the intended use or the principles, philosophy, or background of the applicant organization would be detrimental to the best interest of the school district and its educational program." Finally, "failure to comply with facilities use rules or policies may result in the revocation of the facilities use agreement and/or the denial of the future use of school facilities." It is my expectation that only those applications that violate any part of Operational Procedure 4330 will be denied.

Evidence of Compliance

I certify that all facility use is managed according to district Operational Procedure 4330.

Since September 1, 2009, there were 251 written requests for facility use. Two (2) requests, which represent less than 1% of the total number of requests, were denied because of damages to facilities and failure to comply with facilities use rules during previous use.

If a request for facility use is denied, the applicant can appeal that decision to the YSD Athletic Director. If the matter is not resolved at that level, the next appeal is to the Deputy Superintendent. No such appeals were made in 2009.
