


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Interpretation:

I interpret this to mean that, while not compromising student safety, student functions, and the instructional program, we shall follow the District's facility use operating procedures and accommodate community and public use as outlined in the operating procedures.

Evidence of Compliance:

I certify that all facility use is managed according to District operating procedures. Community use that facilitates student activities is accommodated and encouraged whenever possible.

Each spring the district's facility use coordinator sends a letter to individuals and agencies that used our facilities during that current school year. The letter reminds the individuals and agencies of the timeline for submitting facility use requests for the next school year.

The school district reserves the right to deny use of school facilities to any applicant when the intended use or the principles, philosophy or background of the applicant organization would be detrimental to the best interest of the school district and its educational program. Appeals are made first to the YSD Athletic Director. If the matter is not resolved at that level, the next appeal is to the Deputy Superintendent. No such appeals have been made.
